"The fourth in a planned series of 12 novels, this is another delightful visit with Tim Brown, who owns a small-town newspaper in South River, a fictional town on Nova Scotia's South Shore.

The series is set in 1999, with Tim taking a sabbatical year from the newspaper.

It's April, and Tim is trying to find a cabin that has mysteriously disappeared. Once he starts digging—or delving—into the puzzle, of course he finds out there's much more to the story than he first realized. Tim's thoughtful approach to the mystery and to his everyday life is a pleasure.

Hull brings her small town to beautifully detailed life in this well-written and charming series, with Tim Brown being the likable main character at the centre of a quirky circle of friends and neighbours.
